significance of this country and its democratic experience.

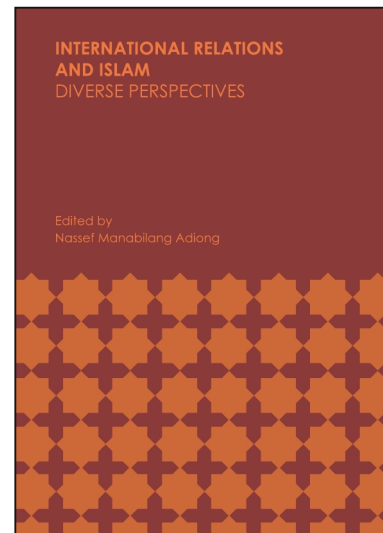
